From The Chair

Dear Friends of IVC,

On behalf of the board and staff, I want to thank you for your support this past year. We know that the current economic challenge has forced many people to seek help, many for the first time in their entire lives. Agencies that serve people in need have also felt the constraints of shrinking resources. IVC, while facing similar challenges this year, made a deep and strong commitment to do everything we could to put the talents, skills and gifts of our volunteers in service to others, especially now. It is due to the efforts of IVC's dedicated volunteers, staff, regional councils and board members – supported by our donors that IVC served thousands of people this past year.

This has been a year of change and growth. We anticipated a decrease in revenue so we strived to significantly cut our expenses at the national and regional levels. In regions where we had to cut back on staffing, volunteer directors have stepped up to the plate. Local regional councils have also grown in membership. These councils are helping IVC raise its visibility and forge local community partnerships.

In every IVC region front-line service agencies have requested more Ignatian Volunteers to keep up with the increasing need for their services. These cash-strapped agencies place a high value on our volunteers; they know that Ignatian Volunteers are highly skilled, reliable and deeply committed. In many cases, our volunteers serve year after year and become a vital part of the good work of the service agency.

IVC not only kept its doors open in a time when many nonprofits have closed, we've seen a significant increase in the numbers of volunteers this year. In fact 25% of current volunteers are new volunteers. Simply put, the need is great but IVC has a great program that can make a difference in the lives of people who are most vulnerable. We are ready to grow and we can accomplish that through the generosity of our friends and donors.

Highlights

- ◆ Thousands of people were assisted by the 285 mature men and women who served as Ignatian Volunteers this past year. Collectively, volunteers contributed over 173,000 hours of service and support to their communities.
- ◆ For the first time in several years IVC increased our number of volunteers. 25% of current volunteers are new.
- ◆ More than 200 Spiritual Reflectors guided volunteers in reflection.
- ◆ IVC saw an increase in the number of Regional Council members nationwide & a deepening of the councils' involvement and commitment to growing the program in their cities
- ◆ IVC hired a new National Executive Director & three new Regional Directors in Northern Virginia, New England, and Omaha & welcomed new volunteer directors in Baltimore, Philadelphia and Minneapolis/ St. Paul dedicated to revitalizing their regions.
- ◆ All regional events exceeded their income goals & raised visibility for IVC in their communities.

- ◆ IVC initiated a new operational model to promote regional autonomy and self-direction resulting in more local community engagement and energy.
- ◆ We successfully transitioned our financial management to a high caliber CPA firm resulting in greater financial transparency and reporting.

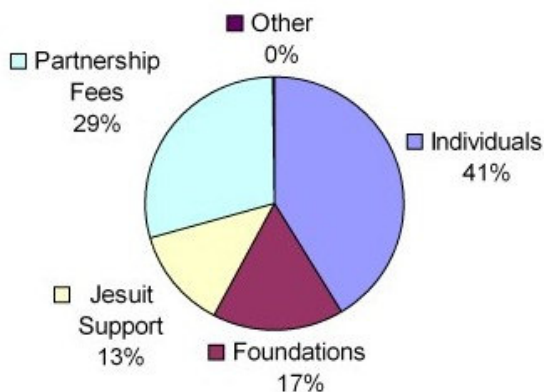
Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Summary:

In 2009-2010, 285 mature men and women served as Ignatian Volunteers at over 258 community service agencies in 16 major metropolitan areas in California, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Virginia, and the District of Columbia. Volunteer contributed over 173,000 hours of service and support to their communities, totaling more than \$3,600,000 nationwide. 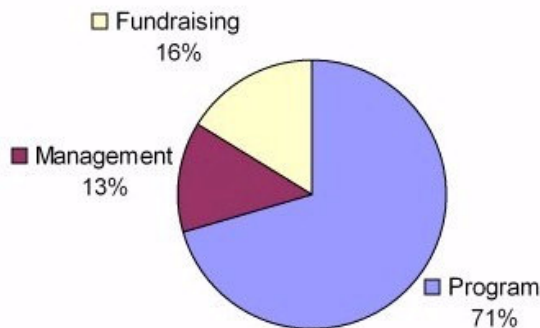
The BBB Wise Giving Alliance Standards for Charity Accountability recommends that an organization spend at least \$0.65 of every dollar on program services. In 2009-2010 \$0.71 of every dollar raised by IVC was used for program services. Our generous individual donors were the main source of funding for IVC at 41%. Fees from our partner agencies were 29%. Foundation grants accounted for 17% and Jesuit Provinces and Communities contributed 13%. IVC weathered this economic storm with only a 13% decrease in annual revenues over 2008-2009, but in anticipation IVC judiciously cut expenses by 20%.
